In Loving Memory

BISHOP KENNETH F. HANEY July 18, 1937 – November 10, 2011

Bishop Kenneth F. Haney, the founder and President of KYCC Radio, passed away on Thursday, November 10, at the age of 74.

Bishop Haney succumbed to a brain tumor that was discovered just weeks ago. His funeral was held at Christian Life Center in Stockton on Thursday, November 17, and was attended by thousands who loved him and were impacted by his ministry.

KYCC was the dream of Kenneth Haney, who envisioned a Christian radio network that would impact the world. We began as KCJH Radio, signing on in March 1975 with an output power of ten watts, covering only the central portion of Stockton. He chose our first call letters, "KCJH," in honor to his late father, Clyde J. Haney.

The elder Haney was pastor of First Pentecostal Church until his death in a tragic car accident in 1971. Soon after, Kenneth was elected pastor of the church, where he had earlier served as Associate Pastor. At the time, the church was located at 1950 Cherokee Road in Stockton.

Under Kenneth's leadership, a new church building was constructed at 9025 West Lane. It opened in 1978, and was officially dedicated as Christian Life Center. This building still holds the main business offices of Christian Life Center and is surrounded by buildings for Christian Life College, Stockton Christian School, and KYCC.

Because of Kenneth's vision for this ministry, KYCC progressed from its ten-watt signal to 26,000 watts in 1984, and ultimately to 41,000 watts in 2009, along with a

network of several other stations and numerous translators. With his approval, we changed the call letters from KCJH to KYCC in 1997.

He was also well-known as the speaker on the program *Landmark Today*, (originally called *The Hour of Restoration*) which aired on the station from 1987-2005 at 5:30 a.m. weekdays. Bishop Haney was also a frequent in-studio guest during our annual on-air fundraisers, and was a master at conveying his vision for this ministry to our audience.

In September 2001, Bishop Haney was elected as the General Superintendent of the United Pentecostal Church International, necessitating a move to St. Louis, Missouri. Soon after, his son Nathaniel was elected pastor of Christian Life Center. In 2004, CLC dedicated its new 5,800-seat sanctuary at 4303 Christian Life Way, which was the fulfillment of a dream of Bishop Haney from years before.

Bishop Haney served eight years as UPCI General Superintendent and returned home to Stockton in 2010. He spent the last years of his life traveling and ministering around the country, as well as spending time with his family. On October 14, 2011, he and his wife Joy marked their 50th wedding anniversary.

He is survived by his wife, Joy, and their five children, KYCC's Sherrie Moran (Tim), Nathaniel Haney (Kim), Elizabeth Shivers (John), Stephanie Montes (Asbel), and Angela Haney, as well as twelve grandchildren. He also leaves behind three sisters, Shirley Garner (KYCC's General Manager), Vangie Britt, and Joni Larson.
